Efforts to Prepare Children for Kindergarten

97 children transitioned from the pro-gram into kindergarten. The percent- ages of children meeting widely held expectations and determined to be “ready for kindergarten” by domain:

Social and Emotional Development:	76%
Approaches To Learning:	85%
Cognition, Math & Science:	74%
Perceptual Motor/Physical Health:	85%
Language and Literacy:	87%

Enrolled Children Received Medical & Dental Exams

It is the comprehensive nature of Head Start pro-gram services for staff to work with families to assure that children receive an annual well child exam and dental exam. In fiscal year 2019-2020:

- 96% of children were up-to-date on a schedule of immunizations.
- 100% had health insurance.
- 94% were up-to-date on a schedule of health care.
- 1% needed follow-up treatment for chronic medical conditions such as asthma or allergies.
- 95% of children received dental exams.
- 28% needed follow-up dental treatment and of those 49% completed the treatment.
